Additional Information

- → Parking at South Shore Conservatory
 - ◆ Parking while the program is in session, will be in the lower parking lot only.
 - ◆ The speed limit in the Conservatory Park is 10 mph. Please use caution as there are small children in the neighborhood and on Conservatory grounds.
 - ◆ Parking for all performances will be on the Conservatory grounds. Please carpool when possible. Security and parking attendants will assist you.
- → Morning sessions begin promptly at 8:00 am. Please arrive early enough each day so that you are seated, warmed-up, and ready to play at 8:00 a.m. Afternoon sessions begin promptly at 12:45 p.m.
- → You are required to bring a folding music stand and pencils to all classes and rehearsals. Students are financially responsible for any music that is lost or damaged.
- → Percussionists are required to bring a mallet bag, which should include a variety of snare drumsticks and mallets.
- → NO food or drinks will be allowed in the buildings or at rehearsals, ONLY water. Please enjoy the beautiful grounds of the Conservatory for lunch.
 → SSC is a

peanut and tree-nut free campus.

- → The office phone may only be used for emergencies.
- → The use of the copy machine and office area is not permitted unless authorized by the program assistant.
- → Lost and found items (music) should be brought to the front desk.
- → The use of cell phones is not permitted during rehearsals or performances.
